President's Report

President Keteltas reported that the PTA had held a variety of events recently including the Walk for the Homeless, the Potomac Pizza night which goes to partially fund the CSES literary magazine and the Ice Skating night event. Upcoming events include the book fair returning to CSES (instead of being held at Barnes & Noble) and will be sponsored by Scholastic Books this year. International night is expected to be held as new parents have offered to manage the committee.

Treasurer's Report

The CSES has approximately \$45,000 in balance at this time. Approximately 196 families have joined the CSES PTA which is about the same number of families that joined in 2005-06 school year. CSES has approximately 230 families total. CSES PTA has received approximately \$6000 from membership fees and sales of the CSES directory. Sally Foster is expected to bring in less this year as well as the Giant Gift cards. The PTA is testing some alternative fundraisers including the Tysons Corner Friends and Family discount ticket sale.

Supplemental Progress Report Cards

Mrs. Thompson opened with an explanation as to how CSES is using the supplemental progress reports as transition to the new report cards being implemented next year in grades 1 and 2. The supplemental progress report cards cover 3 areas: reading, writing and math. Mrs. Thompson reviewed the format of each area. She explained that the supplemental progress report cards are specific and unique to CSES but the indicators used in the reports are indicators specifically developed by Mont. Co. The progress reports essentially replace the written comments but teachers are still able to provide written comments at their own discretion.
